As executive director of the Chicago Metropolitan Sanctuary Alliance from 1991 to 2008, she advocated for human rights and peace-building initiatives; in her retirement, she remains actively committed to these causes, making frequent visits to the region. A founding member of La Casa Norte's board of directors, Martha played an instrumental role in the agency's formation and development. 21 years later, her support of our mission <mark>continues on.</mark> Residents of Evanston, Martha and her husband, Denis, are the proud parents of three grown children and grandparents of five grandchildren.

Fund-A-Need

\$10,000

La Casa Norte served 19,188 people across Chicago in 2022. Our Solid Ground Transitional Housing Program provides housing, education, and healthcare to male-identifying youth ages 18 to 21. By donating \$10,000, you can help make a tangible difference in their lives.

\$5,000

Our youth programs equip clients with essential life skills and developmental opportunities, including art therapy, college and career readiness, basic culinary lessons, and more. Every \$5,000 donated can help fund these transformative programs.

\$2,500

\$2,500 can help reduce accessibility barriers for homeless youth in need of transportation assistance. Your support will help youth clients visit agency locations to meet with case managers, receive necessary services, and attend school, job interviews, medical appointments, and counseling sessions. Ride-share vouchers and bus passes help eliminate accessibility barriers, financial burdens, sources of anxiety, and potential danger.

Last summer, Liliana González embarked on a two-month journey. With her toddler in her arms, she began a slow, winding ascent northward in search of a better life.

"I want my son to have a future. And here, he can. Here, you can."

Liliana, 30, and son Matías, 3, number among the more than 7.1 million refugees and migrants who have left Venezuela. Upon arrival in Chicago, Liliana, her son, and several hundred Venezuelan migrants and asylum seekers were lodged temporarily at a handful of north suburban hotels. There, a network of local nonprofits, civic organizations, and volunteers converged to prepare them for the road ahead.

La Casa Norte is among these organizations.

"While I was at the hotel, that's where I met Luz," says Liliana, referring to Luz Cortez, La Casa Norte's Community Assistance Program Manager. Cortez and her bilingual team provide migrants and asylum seekers with in-person, Spanishlanguage rental application assistance, school and job referrals, legal support, and access to El Mercadito food pantry, a collaboration between La Casa Norte and Nourishing Hope.

"It would have been very different without La Casa Norte, Casa Michoacán, Catholic Charities, and all of the organizations that have been helping us. Very different."

When asked about the future, Liliana smiles broadly.



I feel excited. My hope is to enroll Matías in preschool, find a good job, have some things of my own, maybe even a house. I want to be able to have something all my own, where I can say, 'Look, this is mine. I worked for this.'
